

THE COMPLETE ZIPPER BUYING GUIDE



If you're looking to purchase zippers, here is a complete list of things you will need to know.

This guide will help you know all of the information necessary to order zippers with confidence that you will be getting exactly what you need for your production run.

Let's jump into it!



ZIPPER TYPE

What type of zipper are you looking for?

What will the final zipper application be?

Are you looking for Nylon Coil, Metal, Plastic Molded, Invisible, Invisible Identical, or a Water Resistant zipper?

Every type of zipper that is produced should meet the functional needs of the piece and be balanced with the aesthetic that the designer is trying to achieve. Are you looking for a luxury zipper or a standard metal zipper? Once you know what zipper type you'll be using, then you can move on to the Zipper Style.



ZIPPER APPLICATION

The Zipper Application is referring to the actual usage of the zipper. For example, if you were designing and producing a jacket, with a center front zipper, you will need a **Separating Bottom** zipper. For fly in denim, or the pocket of a jacket a **Closed Bottom** will suit you fine.

Below are Zipper Applications for items you may produce:

Closed Bottom - They are zippers that do not separate at the bottom. They are used on Handbags, ¼ Zip Shirt, Pockets, Cosmetic Bags, Pillows, Footwear, Skirts, Jean/Trouser fly, Dresses and Luggage

Separating Bottom - They are zippers that separate at the bottom. They are used on Jackets, Hoodies, Coats and Outerwear.

Two Way Separating Bottom - These are zippers that have a pin and box on the top and bottom. They also have two zipper pulls. These are used on ski parkas and sleeping bags.

Two Way Closed Bottom - These are zippers that are closed on both ends and have two zipper pulls. They are used on handbags, tents, weekender bags, mattress covers and pillowcases.

Zippers by the Yard (LongChain) - If you or your contractor prefer to build your own zipper, this is for you. Zippers are ordered by gauge and yards. You choose the pulls that correspond with the type of zippers on our zipper collection and if needed, top and bottom stops.



ZIPPER GAUGE



Here at UCAN Zippers USA, when we refer to gauge size, we are talking about the size/width of the teeth measured in millimeters. We produce gauges from #2 - #10 across all the different types of zippers.

That said, you will need to get an idea of how big you want the teeth to be, to again, meet the functional demand of the piece as well as the aesthetic desires. For handbags a #5 gauge is the most common for the outside zipper with a #3 or #4 on the inside pockets. On denim, it is usually a #4 with some instances of a #5 brass.

If the zipper is a Metal zipper, then move on to the Zipper Finish. If it's a Nylon Coil or Plastic Molded zipper, then skip to the Zipper Length.

Gauge = Width of teeth

ZIPPER FINISH

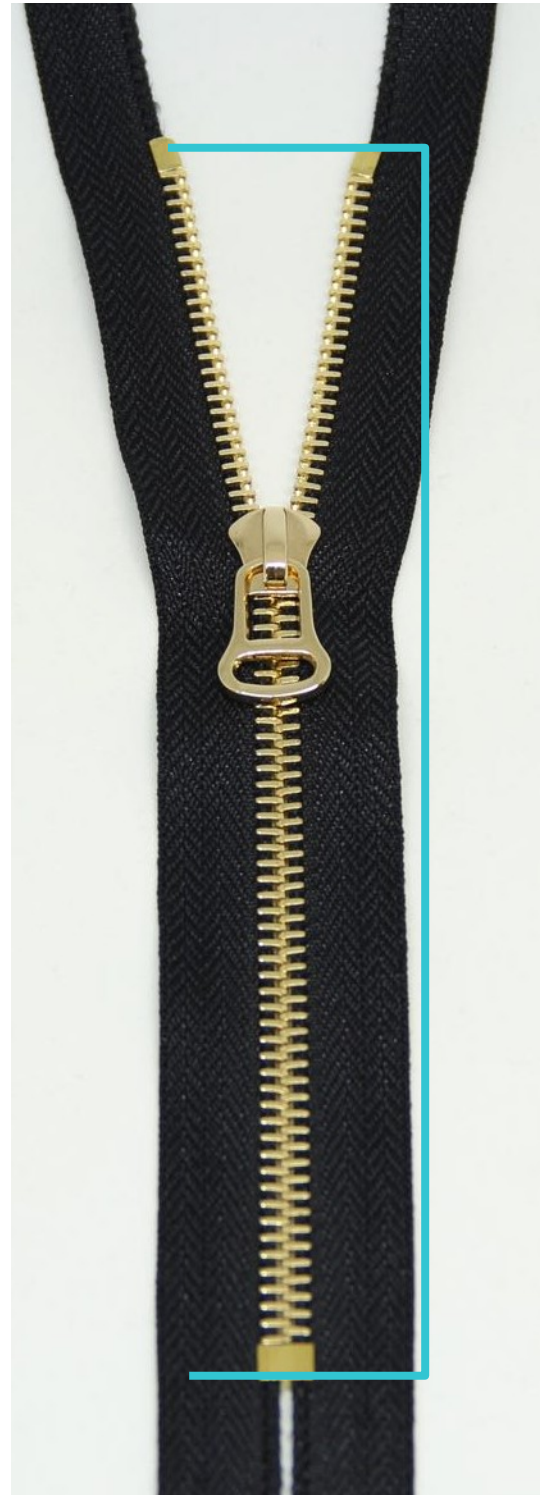


Zipper finish only applies to metal zippers. Are you looking for brass, nickel, gun metal, antikenickel, antique brass, etc? While the finish is mostly for aesthetics, there are occasions where the type of finish should be considered for the kind of processing the garment will be going through. Most often we see this with the denim industry. With all of the chemical washes used to achieve a certain finish or look, the type of metal zipper finish should be planned in advance to ensure the zipper will survive the garment wash required.

ZIPPER LENGTH

This and the next one are pretty straightforward, at least it should be. What length will you need your zipper to be?

When you measure a zipper, you DO NOT include the length of the tape extenders. You only measure from top stop to bottom stop for your TRUE zipper length - metal to metal.

ZIPPER TAPE COLOR

Colors are probably the most subjective zipper part that we deal with. While you may think that red is red or blue is blue, it's not. Here's why. Once you've selected your tape color, you have to think about what type of light you approved the color under. Was it fluorescent, whitelight, or were you outside using sunlight? If you were outside, was it noon day sun or afternoon sun?

When you approve your tape colors, be consistent with the light source being used while reviewing and approving colors. Here at the UCAN Zippers USA, we most often use white light in a controlled environment, unless otherwise specified by our clients.



ZIPPER QUANTITY

When purchasing wholesale zippers, you're going to run into minimums. Our minimums are in line with the smallest amount we can produce. Some wholesale zipper companies will impose a quantity minimum, while others may impose a yardage minimum.

Our production minimums are as follows:

Classic Metal

#4 - 200 yards

#5 - 150 yards

#8 - 150 yards

Plastic Molded

#3 - 200 yards

#5 - 200 yards

#10 - 100 yards

Nylon Coil

#3 - 200 yards

#7 - 100 yards

#8 - 100 yards

#10 - 100 yards

Invisible Mesh

#2 - 200 yards

Water Resistant

Black Tape:

200 yards
